*Send home reading bags with books that are on your child's instructional level.

*Hold parent conferences throughout the year to keep families informed of student progress.

*Host a Kindergarten Step-Up night to inform families of Kindergarten expectations and curriculum.

At Home

The home and school connection is vital to our students' success in school. Here are some ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math. Families may have other ideas to add to this list: *Reinforce the 4 school wide expectations – Be Respectful, Responsible, Safe, and Kind. Every Mariner Matters, Every Moment Counts! *Ensure your child arrives to school on time in order to promote good learning habits. *Read the class newsletter each month and check out the school website regularly for new ideas to support your child.

*Check weekly conduct sheet and emails regularly for updates from the classroom teacher.

*Read nightly with your child and talk about how the story connects with things your child has experienced. (This can include reading to your child and, later in the year, your child reading to you!)

*Play games to review Kindergarten core words and numbers.

*Have fun with math. Use objects at home to practice skills learned at school and connect math to everyday living.

*Go over work sent home with your child.
